Our Local History Seminars have been well attended. Topics follow the area's history from the Paleolithic Period through the construction of Lake Wallenpaupack. Ingrid Peterec, Chief of Interpretation, Upper Delaware Scenic and Recreational River, National Park Service was our first seminar speaker and spoke about the people who inhabited Northeast Pennsylvania before the Europeans arrived and the Lenape. The following week, Jon Tandy described the land controversy between Pennsylvania and Connecticut in the 1700s which led to the Pennamite Wars. During the following weeks, the histories of Wayne and Pike Counties were presented by Carol Dunn and Ann O'Hara (Wayne County Historical Society) and Kristen Brown (Wallenpaupack Historical Society) and Lori Strelecki (Pike County Historical Society).

Genealogy and Cemetery Committee



Tribute to the Model T

On August 19, 1918 Henry Ford, Thomas Edison, Harvey Firestone and John Burroughs were guests at the Summit Inn near Uniontown, Pennsylvania. From there, they embarked with their Ford Model T's on a road trip adventure through Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Tennessee and Virginia. 100 years later to the day, Greentown residents Dale and Margo Rogers along with other Ford Model T owners retraced some of that historical journey. On July 27, Dale and Margo recounted their commemorative trip last year. They arrived in their beautifully restored Model T which had made the journey. Joining us were several other antique car enthusiasts who shared their vehicle restoration stories.



Minnesota Sewing Machine



Volunteer Barry Moore gave this Minnesota Sewing Machine (Model H) the tender loving care it needed to operate -- just a little WD30! The treadle machine, built in 1949 and mounted in its original wooden cabinet, was donated by Society member Barbara Blitz.

Minnesota Sewing Machines were the primary sewing machine trade name for many years of sewing machines sold by Sears, Roebuck and Company beginning in 1894. They were named in honor of Richard Sears home state. Later, other Sears sewing machine models were named Iowa, Burdick and Kenmore.

Wayne County Community Foundation Grant



Beth Gleim, Wayne County Community Foundation (WCCF) board member and Grants Committee member (center) presented a check to Society President Jeanne Brown and GDHS Director Suzanne Urton to help fund a metal handicap accessible ramp in the rear of Peggy Bancroft Hall. History for Young People



Fourteen members of Daisy Troop 50749 (left) visited Peggy Bancroft Hall in early June where they were introduced to “Legendary Ladies”. Docents Ruth Altemier, Bernadine Lennon, Diane Smith and Suzanne Urton selected local women who represented the arts, education, home and family life, and the pioneer spirit and introduced the girls to them through handouts and discussion. Daisy Troop leader Tracy Stender commented that the girls were very attentive during the presentations since they could relate to the women and where they lived. We have partnered with Daisy Troop 50749 for the past several years in planting flowers at abandoned cemeteries in the area and look forward to more collaboration with them.

A Trip to Lake Paupac



Lake Paupac Club hosted Society members at the Club's historic lodge on August 5. Club members guided us through the lodge which was followed by a presentation on the history of the club by Lili Cohen (left). Afterward we were treated to refreshments on the lodge's patio overlooking Lake Paupac. Seen enjoying the view are Diane Smith, Scot Brown and Jeanne Brown.

Beginning with Philadelphia landscape architect J. Franklin Meehan's purchase of property around Lake Paupac in the 1880s, Lake Paupac has always been known by those who lived there for its natural beauty. Initially built as hunting and fishing camp, the property was then purchased by Joseph W. and Lucile Mott who converted the property to a private estate.

Joseph Mott served as general manager and an owner of the Hotel Traymore in Atlantic City, where the family lived. He also served as president of the Hotel Traymore Corporation.

When the Motts decided to sell the property, a group of Swathmore College friends purchased Lake Paupac in 1949 and formed a corporation of landowners. For over 140 years, each owner of Lake Paupac has shared the same vision: to preserve the beauty of the natural lake and surrounding hills and woods which comprise 1,000 acres.

We appreciate the warmth and hospitality extended to us by members of Lake Paupac Club and look forward to hosting them at Peggy Bancroft Hall in the future.

Veteran History Project

We continue to collect information for men and women who served in the military regardless of whether they served during wartime. To date, we have documented over 730 veterans who lived or attended school in Greene or Dreher Townships. We appreciate everyone who has assisted us in this project including Gerre Haussler and Julie Hazelton who recently provided information. In addition to completed Veteran Biographical Forms, we have received photographs, uniforms, medals, Navy cruise books, military certificates, letters, etc which are valued additions to the Society's collection.

Over the past three years, we have documented veterans who served from the Revolutionary War to the present. We encourage anyone who is a veteran and who has not completed a Veteran Biographical Form to contact us for one. Completed forms are entered in the Society's Veteran History Project database for future research and displays.

Highlights from 3rd Grade Visit



During their visit, Jeanne Brown discussed how vegetables and fruits were preserved in a root cellar and the nutritional importance of sauerkraut in the diets of early settlers. Retired teacher Carol Brown recounted how women one hundred years ago would organize their housework with certain chores assigned to certain days of the week. Barry Moore demonstrated the mechanical advantage of using a pulley to lift a 100 pound bag in the barn. Through photographs and artifacts from our collection, Ruth Altemier recalled what businesses were located in 1950 Newfoundland.
